Strengths of the course and of the instructor: -

Weaknesses of the course and of the instructor: -

 - Due to being so well versed in this material, it may be iddicult at times to teach the material in a way for those less familiar with it to understand. Also, the course is math-heavy for the PSETs whereas examples in class were more frequently of an easier level. It made learning the concept fine, but do to the math requirements it became much more of a burden. Also helping us as students understand the needed process was something that lan worked on this semester, per feedback post first exam, and he has improved, but there's room to grow further.
 - I felt I had good understanding of all the course concepts (and if it wasn't good, I went to office hours) but there were two periods of time when I kept getting low problem set scores. More practice problems and being shown a wider breadth of problem type before exams would've been helpful.

 - Not providing enough examples to work on with actual numbers. Grading extremely harshly for small mistakes on homework.
 - He speaks too slow but at perfect speed once **X**1.5. Best for online classes as I can watch the recordings and adjust the speed! Homework and exams are much harder than the examples he went through during the lecture.
